2016 Bishop, **92 Points**

Even better than the 2015, Glaetzer's 2016 Bishop is very similar in style, with many of the same notes of charred meat, espresso, black olives and blackberries, but with a greater sense of freshness and vitality, even a touch of red raspberry fruit. It's full-bodied and supple, turning velvety on the long finish. I'm being conservative in estimating its drinking window, but I wouldn't be surprised if it were still going strong in 2030.

Bishop is Ben's everyday Shiraz and it packs a meaningful punch. Drawing on many of the flavours which I find in Amon-Ra, Bishop is simply a more forward and genial creation designed to get into its stride with little fuss and no delay. What makes 2016 Bishop a little different to previous vintages is the year itself – jaw-dropping in terms of class and refinement. For this reason, I am happy to suggest that 2016 Bishop is possibly a finer and more balance wine than some of the early Amon-Ra wines and you can only achieve this if you keep pushing every single year to make better and better wines.

2016 Bishop, **96 Points**

Impressively coloured the wine displays a dense inky black core with a deep dark purple black hue. A pronounced nose sends aromatics of liquorice, ripe black cherries and blackberries sailing through the olfactory senses. Nuances of lightly toasted vanillin cedar, dark plum and black pepper ensue. Full bodied, lavish flavours of liquorice, dark plums and black cherries cascade across the plate underscored by a touch of blueberry, lightly toasted vanillin cedar, notions of crushed rock and black pepper. The wine is carried by a sturdy yet ripe tannin structure and balanced acidity that add some muscle to the opulence. Superb power wave with the richness of fruit shining through on a long finish of peppered liquorice, dark plum, black cherries, crushed rock and lightly toasted vanillin cedar.
